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Sahil asks:

Juhi, what exactly is identity theft?

Juhi explains:

It's when someone uses your personal information-such as your name, ID number, or financial details-without permission, often to open accounts, make purchases, or pretend to be you.

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Sahil asks:

What's one of the easiest ways to protect my online accounts?

Juhi explains:

Use a different strong password for each important account. If one password is stolen, your other accounts are less likely to be affected.

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Sahil asks:

Is a strong password enough?

Juhi explains:

Not always. Turn on two-factor authentication when it's available. It adds another security check even if someone gets your password.

Sahil asks:

How would I know if someone is using my financial information?

Juhi explains:

Check your bank and credit card activity regularly. Investigate purchases, withdrawals, or payments you don't recognize.

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Sahil asks:

Should I check my credit too?

Juhi explains:

Yes. Review your credit reports for accounts or inquiries you didn't authorize. An unfamiliar account can be an early warning sign.

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Sahil asks:

What if someone calls or texts asking me to confirm personal information?

Juhi explains:

Don't provide it just because the message looks official. Contact the organization using a trusted phone number, app, or website you find independently.

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Sahil asks:

What personal information should I be especially careful with?

Juhi explains:

Protect government ID numbers, banking information, passwords, and verification codes. Share sensitive information only when you know why it's needed and who is receiving it.

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Sahil asks:

Can paper documents create identity-theft risks too?

Juhi explains:

Yes. Store important documents securely and shred sensitive papers before throwing them away.

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Sahil asks:

What about my phone and computer?

Juhi explains:

Keep them updated and protected with a screen lock. Your devices can contain emails, saved accounts, photos, and other information useful to an identity thief.

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Sahil asks:

What should I do if I notice something suspicious?

Juhi explains:

Act quickly. Contact the affected bank, company, or other organization through an official channel. Change compromised passwords and follow the appropriate identity-theft reporting and recovery steps for your country.

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Juhi's Quick Check

- Are my important passwords unique?
- Is two-factor authentication turned on?
- Have I checked my financial activity?
- Have I reviewed my credit information?
- Are my important documents and devices protected?
