Should I learn how to check AI answers too?

Babli explains:

Absolutely. AI can produce confident-sounding information that is incomplete or incorrect. Learning to question claims, check important facts, and use reliable sources is one of the most important AI skills.

That's extremely useful. AI usually performs better when it understands the audience, purpose, background, limitations, and desired outcome of the task.

BABLI'S ACTION: Give AI the context it needs-not every detail you know.

Vipul asks:

Should I learn to use AI for more than asking questions?

Babli explains:

Yes. Practice using it to summarize, brainstorm, compare options, organize information, draft content, analyze material, and improve existing work. Different tasks teach you different ways to collaborate with AI.

BABLI'S ACTION: Practice AI on real tasks you already do.

Vipul asks:

Is it important to know what AI cannot do well?

Babli explains:

Very important. AI has limitations and can misunderstand instructions, miss context, or make things up. Knowing when human judgment or expert advice is needed is part of using AI responsibly.

BABLI'S ACTION: Learn AI's limitations along with its capabilities.

Vipul asks:

Do privacy skills matter when using AI?

Babli explains:

Yes. Think carefully before entering confidential, personal, financial, business, or other sensitive information into an AI service. Understand the privacy and data controls of the service you use.

BABLI'S ACTION: Check before sharing sensitive information with AI.

Vipul asks:

Should I learn automation and coding too?

Babli explains:

They can be valuable next steps, especially if you want AI to help with repeated workflows, data, software, or business processes. But you don't need to start there-build strong everyday AI skills first.

BABLI'S ACTION: Add automation or coding when it supports your goals.

Vipul asks:

With AI changing so quickly, what skill will stay useful?

Babli explains:

Learning how to learn. Specific AI tools will change, but the ability to define problems, ask good questions, evaluate results, adapt, and use human judgment will remain valuable.

BABLI'S ACTION: Learn principles, not just buttons and features.
